
# **Math & Science Frontiers**

#### Geometry -

First grade started a new math unit last month. It began with students being asked to identify solid objects shaped like spheres, cubes, cylinders, cones, and prisms. They learned to recognize the plane shapes that make up the flat surfaces (faces) of the solid figures, and shared their observations with each other. Expect to hear about the relationship between two-dimensional shapes and three-dimensional figures from your child as well.

Studying the attributes of shapes will lead to a more sophisticated level of geometric thinking. Please help you child become comfortable using these terms:
