Math & Science Frontiers

Place Value -

Mr. Cole's first graders will soon start a new math unit; Place Value, Data & Graphs. Students will learn about numbers made with tens and ones. They will also collect information (data) to produce various types of graphs. Some of the math words that first graders will be introduced to include:

hundreds tens ones equals less greater

You may choose to play guessing games with your child using these math words. For example, think of a number between 1 and 100. If your number is 37 you might say: "I am thinking of an odd number between 35 and 39." Continue to give clues using the words greater and less. And as always, many of the math games that are played at school will be sent home.
